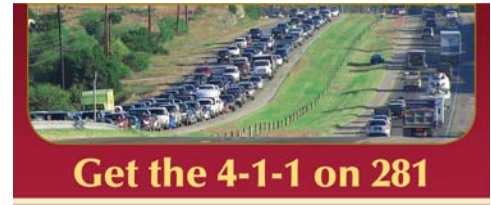

Construction schedule for the Alamo RMA US 281 Super Street
Weather permitting; the following construction closures will take place.
For the week of: Sunday, August 29, 2010 – Thursday, September 2, 2010

Encino Rio

Major lane closures at this intersection will occur this weekend to place surface asphalt, restripe lanes and finalize signalization work. Upon completion this intersection will be placed in Super Street mode.

Intersection of 281 North and Evans Road (North and South bound lanes)

Crews will continue placing curb at the turn-around north and south of Evans between 9:30 p.m. and 5:30 a.m. Single inside lane closures for both directions will be required. Signalization work continues in preparation of opening this intersection in Super Street mode in mid-September.

US 281 and Stone Oak

Crews will continue to widen the center median of US 281 north and south bound of Stone Oak. The inside lane of south bound US 281 will be closed between 9:30 p.m. and 5:30 a.m. Detour of North bound lanes will continue to be in effect to allow work on the turn-arounds north and south of Stone Oak.

Intersection of 281 North and Marshall Road (North and South bound lanes)

Crews will continue to widen the center median of US 281 north and south bound of Marshall. The inside lane of north and south bound US 281 will be closed between 9:30 p.m. and 5:30 a.m. Crews continue concrete rail work on the u-turns north and south of Marshall during the day from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. and will not affect traffic.

Previous Activity for week of August 22, 2010

The contractor completed signal work at the u-turns north and south of Evans.

The Alamo RMA apologizes for any delays encountered in this phase of construction and suggest you might adjust your travel plan to avoid these lane closures when possible.
